ULTRAMARATHON MAASAI MARA 50 KM RUN

2022 RACE INFORMATION







What is the UltraMARAthon?

Started in 2020, the UltraMARAthon is a 50km single-day foot race through the conservancies of the northern Maasai Mara ecosystem in Kenya. The race, run either as an individual or as part of a relay team, takes participants through several conservancies giving them a unique sporting experience within one of Africa's jewels.

The proceeds from the event go directly to supporting initiatives in the region that are aimed at protecting both wildlife and the environment, and enhancing the lives of the community members who live there.





Location

The event this year will traverse the Enonkishu, Lemek, Ol Choro and Mara North Conservancies.

The Cause

The greater Maasai Mara is one of Kenya's key ecosystems and provides an essential barrier between agricultural areas and the Maasai Mara reserve itself. The stewards in the greater Mara area rely primarily on tourism to manage and protect the ecosystem, which given the seasonal nature of tourism in the area and the current pandemic presents significant challenges for their sustainability.

The goal of the UltraMARAthon is to raise funds to support key initiatives in the region related to conservation and enhancing the livelihoods of local communities. The initiatives being supported include:

- **Mara Elephant Project** funding for the recruitment, training and deployment of rangers specifically to address poaching, human/wildlife conflict and habitat loss challenges in the region.
- Africa Mission Services Birth Center funding to expand a women's health center located in Engos, which serves a population of approximately 7,000 local Maasai, providing prenatal/postnatal care, family planning education and services, and assists 50 60 women in childbirth each month.
- **Ranger support** funding for uniforms, equipment and general administration for the conservancies involved in the event.

In addition, this event will encourage tourism to the Mara conservancies and provide beneficial exposure on both national and international levels, raising awareness of the challenges of conserving and managing this iconic yet threatened ecosystem during these difficult times.

AFRICA MISSION

Africa Mission Services (AMS) is a non-governmental organisation based in Maasai Mara, Kenya that operates the Africa Mission Services Community Health Clinic & Birth Center. Located in Engos, the clinic serves a population of approximately 7,500 community members. The AMS Clinic works closely with the Kenya Ministry of Health providing access to primary and preventative medical care, childhood immunisations, HIV counselling and testing, maternity services, newborn care, education, and access to modern family planning methods. Through offering evidenced-based care, AMS seeks to fill the gap in local healthcare, providing the community a medical centre where they can receive expert care, be treated with respect, and their cultural practices valued.

MARA ELEPHANT PROJECT



Mara Elephant Project (MEP, est. 2011) protects elephants and their habitats across the Greater Mara Ecosystem in Kenya, one of the last wildlife refuges on Earth. When poaching emerged as a threat, MEP and Kenya Wildlife Service took action to successfully combat it. Today, the drastic expansion of the human footprint is causing habitat loss and increasing conflict between people and wildlife. For over a decade, our Kenyan male and female rangers and researchers have been working to build a better future for their families by protecting elephants and their habitats for generations to come.
